



## Specialty Courts Breakdown

- **Adult Drug Court (minimum 18-month program)**
  - Identified substance use disorder (can have low-to-moderate mental health needs as well)
  - All history of violent offenses or drug trafficking will be staffed on an individual basis
  - No history of sex offenses
- **Creating Engagement through Resources and Treatment (CERT) (minimum 18-month program)**
  - Adolescents 14 to 17 years of age, who are certified as adults pursuant to the Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 62B.390
  - Identified alcohol/substance abuse disorder or mental health/psychiatric diagnosis
  - Violent and/or sex offenses staffed on a case-by-case basis
- **Co-Occurring Disorders Court (minimum 18-month program)**
  - Identified mental health and substance use disorder (must have both)
  - Clients must be able to establish independent housing within four months of starting the program
  - Applications must include medical records documenting mental health diagnosis.
- **EMPOWER Court (22-week program)**
  - Youth 12-18 years of age (under 12 will be assessed for clinically age appropriate services)
  - Adjudicated and pre-adjudicated cases
  - Any adolescent/family DV coming through the juvenile justice system
- **Felony DUI (3-5-year program)**
  - Minimum of three DUI *charges* within a seven year period
  - Identified substance use disorder
  - Applicants with any previous felony DUI *convictions* or those who have previously participated in the program will not be eligible
- **Gambling Treatment Diversion Court (minimum 16 months)**
  - The crime must have been committed in furtherance or as a result of problem gambling (see NRS 458A.210)
  - A pre-sentencing hearing must be held to determine eligibility. Applications will be considered for participation in the program once the sentencing Judge makes the required findings per the NRS statutes
- **IMPACT Program (12-week program)**
  - 12-18 years old with marijuana-related substance abuse issues
  - Identified Cannabis use disorder based on DSM-5 criteria
  - Youth Level of Service/Case Management Inventory (YLS/CMI) score is medium/moderate to high risk
- **MAT Re-Entry Treatment Court (minimum 6-month program)**
  - For individuals on parole or inmates within 2 years of release
  - Individuals on parole must have minimum of 6 months remaining on parole
  - Identified opiate and/or stimulant use disorder
  - Additional mental health and substance abuse needs can be treated
  - All history of violent, trafficking/sales, and arson cases will be staffed on a case-by-case basis
  - No history of sex offenses
- **Mental Health Court (minimum 15-month program)**
  - Identified serious mental health disorder (can have substance use disorders as well)
  - All cases will be staffed individually- no automatic disqualifying factors
  - Applications must include medical records documenting mental health diagnosis/es within the past 5 years
- **Opportunity for Probation with Enforcement in Nevada (OPEN) (minimum 12-month program)**
  - 18-26 year olds only
  - Intended for those who need additional assistance complying with rules of probation
  - Limited substance abuse and mental health needs (staffed on a case-by-case basis)
  - No history of sex offenses

- Violent offenses staffed on a case-by-case basis
- **Safe Babies Court Program**
  - 18-26 years old parents
  - Identified substance use disorder
  - Substance exposed/ingested infant aged 0-3, non-marijuana
  - Open case with CCFS
  - First time removal of infant
- **Transitional Age Program (TAP) (minimum 18-month program)**
  - 18-25.5 years olds only
  - Identified substance use disorder
  - No history of sex offenses
  - Violent offenses staffed on a case-by-case basis
- **Veterans Treatment Court (18-month program)**
  - Veterans or members of the US Military only
  - Must have a substance abuse or mental health diagnosis
  - No category A felony or a sexual offense as defined in [NRS 179D.097](#) that is punishable as a category B felony
- **Juvenile Drug Treatment Court (9-12 month program)**
  - 14-17 years of age at time of the referral (exceptions will be staffed on a case by case bases)
  - Identified alcohol/substance abuse disorder based on DSM-5 criteria
  - Youth Level of Service/Case Management Inventory (YLS/CMI) score is medium/moderate to high risk
- **Detention Alternative for Autistic Youth (DAAY) Court**
  - 10 to 18 years of age \*
  - 6 months preferred prior to participants 18<sup>th</sup> birthday \*
  - Diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) documented on an IEP, Neuropsychological evaluation (in or out of Nevada), or other documentation supported by testing or an FA-11 form or suspected Autism from a credible source (pediatrician, school. therapist, psychologist, etc.).
